Finished Quilt Approximately: 68" x 80-3/4" - Finished Block Size: 12-3/4" x 12-3/4"

Winter Woodlands fabrics by Exclusively Quilters - Style #3779

Fabric Requirements: Based on 44" wide fabric

Ten Winter Woodlands Panels (#60002-8)

1/2 yard wildlife print (#60003-9)

1-3/4 yards black swirl (#9135-8)

1 yard tan texture (#8631-4)

1 yard gold leaf (#8340-4)

1 yard dark blue texture (#8631-20)

1/3 yard light blue texture (#8631-2)

2/3 yard dark brown swirl (#9135-9)

1-1/4 yards winter woodlands print (#60004-2)

1/2 yard blue leaf (#8340-2)

5-1/4 yards fabric for backing (#60003-9 wildlife print suggested)

76" x 90" quilt batting

An added 1/8 to 1/2 yard is added to all yardages to account for shrinkage, straightening, cutting errors and prints that may require special cutting to get the best results.

You should protect your investment in time and fabric by making sample blocks before cutting into your fabric because Exclusively Quilters will take no responsibility for replacing fabrics.

Shops who wish to kit this design are responsible for figuring yardage for their kits if they wish to reduce yardages.

Cutting Directions: All measurements based on a 1/4" seam allowance.

From the **Winter Woodlands Panels:**

Trim each of the panels to 11" square

From the **wildlife print** fabric:

Fussy cut ten 4-1/4" squares with an animal head centered

From the **black swirl** fabric:

Cut eight 2-1/2" x 44" strips for binding

Cut fifteen 1-5/8" x 44" strips recut into ten 1-5/8" x 11", twenty 1-5/8" x 12-1/8" and 1-5/8" x 13-1/4" strips

Cut seven 1-1/2" x 44" strips

From the **tan texture** fabric:

Cut four 2-1/2" x 44" strips for border

Cut five 2" x 44" strips recut into ten 2" x 10-1/4" and ten 2" x 8-3/4" strips

Cut four 1-1/2" x 44" strips for border

From the **gold leaf** fabric:

Cut four 5" x 44" strips for border

Cut four 2" x 44" strips recut into ten 2" x 7-1/4" and ten 2" x 5-3/4" strips

From the **dark blue texture** fabric:

Cut four 2-1/2" x 44" strips for border

Cut six 2" x 44" strips recut into ten 2" x 11-3/4" and ten 2" x 10-1/4" strips

Cut four 1-1/2" x 44" strips for border

From the **light blue texture** fabric:

Cut three 2" x 44" strips recut into ten 2" x 5-3/4" and ten 2" x 4-1/4" strips

From the **dark brown swirl** fabric:

Cut seven 2" x 44" strips recut into ten 2" x 13-1/4" and ten 2" x 11-3/4" strips

From the **winter woodlands print** fabric:

Cut three 5" x 36" strips lengthwise, parallel to the border

Cut four 5" x remaining width of fabric, about 25"

From the **blue leaf** fabric:

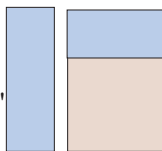
Cut five 2" x 44" strips recut into ten 2" x 8-3/4" and ten 2" x 7-1/4" strips

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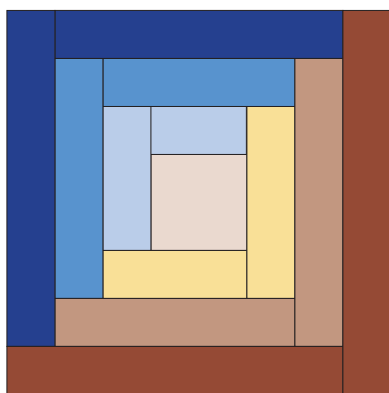
Log Cabin Blocks:

1. Stitch a 2" x 4-1/4" light blue texture strip to the top of a 4-1/4" wildlife print square. Sew a 2" x 5-3/4" light blue texture strip to the left side of the wildlife print.



2. Continue adding strips to the block in a counter-clockwise direction:

- 2" x 5-3/4" gold leaf strip
- 2" x 7-1/4" gold leaf strip
- 2" x 7-1/4" blue leaf strip
- 2" x 8-3/4" blue leaf strip
- 2" x 8-3/4" tan texture strip
- 2" x 10-1/4" tan texture strip
- 2" x 10-1/4" dark blue texture strip
- 2" x 11-3/4" dark blue texture strip
- 2" x 11-3/4" dark brown swirl strip
- 2" x 13-1/4" dark brown swirl strip



3. Make a total of ten Log Cabin Blocks.

Panel Blocks:

1. Stitch a 1-5/8" x 11" black strip to top of each 11" panel. Add 1-5/8" x 12-1/8" black strips to left side, then to bottom of each panel. Finish by adding 1-5/8" x 13-1/4" black strip to right side of each panel.



Assembly:

1. Lay out the blocks in five rows of four blocks each, alternating between the Panel Blocks and Log Cabin Blocks. Stitch blocks into rows. Sew rows together.

2. Make two extra long borders, each with two 1-1/2" x 44" black swirl strips sewn together end-to-end. Stitch these to the right and left side of the rows, press and trim.

3. Cut one 1-1/2" x 44" black swirl strip in half. Sew each half-length strip end-to-end with a full-length strip. Add to the top and bottom of quilt center. Press and trim.

Borders:

1. Make two of each border listed, each with two 44" length strips sewn together end-to-end.

- 2-1/2" tan texture
- 5" gold leaf
- 1-1/2" tan texture
- 2-1/2" dark blue texture
- 1-1/2" dark blue texture

2. Piece a horizontal winter woodlands border that is about 88" long - using the 5" x 25" strips, matching the print as much as possible.

3. Piece a vertical winter woodland border that is about 88" long - using the 5" x 36" strips, matching the print as much as possible.

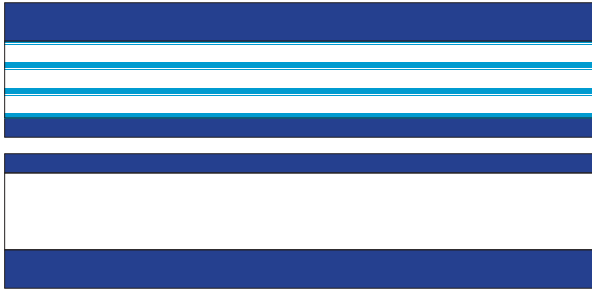
4. Make two borders each in the following order: 2-1/2" tan texture, 5" gold leaf then 1-1/2" tan texture.



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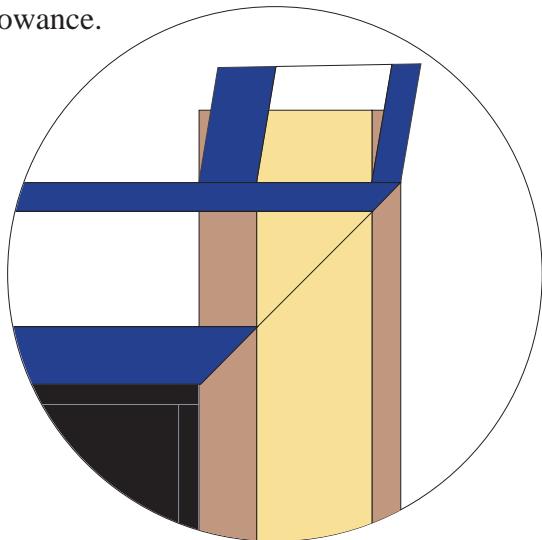
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5. Make two borders each in the following order: 2-1/2" dark blue texture, 5" winter woodland (one horizontal, one vertical) then 1-1/2" dark blue texture. NOTE: refer to the quilt graphic for the direction of the winter woodland print in relation to the 2-1/2" and 1-1/2" dark blue texture strips.



6. Referring to the quilt diagram, center the right and left borders along the sides of the quilt and sew them in place. After centering them on the quilt, stitch the top and bottom borders in place starting and stopping at the side seams.

7. Working on one corner at a time, miter the border corners as shown in this graphic of the upper right corner of quilt. Fold the top border under itself and up so it is even with the excess right border strip. Adjust the border so it is a 45 degree angle. Hand or machine stitch the top border to the right border. From the back of the quilt, trim the excess border strips to 1/4" seam allowance.



Finishing:

1. Cut backing into two equal lengths. Sew the two lengths together along selvage edges. Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt or tie as desired.

2. Prepare binding from eight 2-1/2" x 44" strips of black swirl fabric. Sew strips together into one long binding strip. Press strip in half lengthwise.

3. Carefully trim backing and batting even with quilt top.

4. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to 1/4" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.

5. Turn binding to back of quilt and blind stitch in place.
