

P Winter Woodlands Wall Quilt P

Finished Quilt Approximately: 37-1/2" x 52-1/2" - Approximate Panel Size: 24" x 39"

Winter Woodlands fabrics by Exclusively Quilters - Style #3779

Fabric Requirements: Based on 44" wide fabric

One Winter Woodlands panel (#60002-8)

1/3 yard tan texture (#8631-4)

1/2 yard light blue texture (#8631-2)

1-1/4 yard winter woodland (#60004-2)

5/8 yard dark blue texture (#8631-20)

2-3/4 yards fabric for backing

(#60003-9 wildlife print suggested)

45" x 57" quilt batting

An added 1/8 to 1/2 yard is added to all yardages to account for shrinkage, straightening, cutting errors and prints that may require special cutting to get the best results.

You should protect your investment in time and fabric by making sample blocks before cutting into your fabric because Exclusively Quilters will take no responsibility for replacing fabrics.

Shops who wish to kit this design are responsible for figuring yardage for their kits if they wish to reduce yardages.

Cutting Directions: All measurements based on a 1/4" seam allowance.

From the ***tan texture*** fabric:

Cut four 1-1/2" x 44" strips for border

From the ***light blue texture*** fabric:

Cut four 2-1/4" x 44" strips for border

From the ***winter woodland*** fabric:

Cut two 4-1/2" x 36" strips cut lengthwise - parallel to border

Cut four 4-1/2" x remaining width of fabric, about 30"

From the ***dark blue texture*** fabric:

Cut five 2-1/2" x 44" strips for binding.

Sewing Directions:

1. Trim the Winter Woodlands panel to approximately 24-1/2" x 39-1/2". The final size of the panel may vary from these measurements. The directions will not change, just the final finished size of the quilt.
2. Stitch a 1-1/2" x 44" tan strip to right and left sides of the panel. Press and trim excess from these and all successive border additions. Sew a 1-1/2" x 44" tan strip to top and bottom of panel.
3. Add a 2-1/4" light blue border in the same manner as the first border.
4. Sew a 4-1/2" x 36" winter woodland strip (cut lengthwise) to the right and left sides of quilt. Make two borders each with two 4-1/2" x 30" strips sewn together end-to-end. Add these to the top and bottom of quilt.
5. Cut backing into two equal lengths. Sew the two lengths together along selvage edges. Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt or tie as desired.
6. Prepare binding from five 2-1/2" x 44" strips of dark blue. Sew strips together into one long binding strip. Press strip in half lengthwise.
7. Carefully trim backing and batting even with quilt top.
8. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to 1/4" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
9. Turn binding to back of quilt and blind stitch in place.
