

# a Trick or Treat Runnerb

Quilt by Deb Mosa

Finished Runner Approximately: 21" x 55-1/2" - Finished Block Size: 10" x 10"

**Trick or Treat**fabrics by Exclusively Quilters - Style #3780

## **Fabric Requirements:** Based on 44" wide fabric

1/2 yard scattered motifs (#60007-8)

1/2 yard patchwork print (#60006-8)

1/4 yard green bats (#60010-6)

1/3 yard black bats (#60010-3)

3/8 yard orange spiders (#60009-7)

3/8 yard purple spiders (#60009-3)

2/3 yard orange bats on black (#60010-78)

1-7/8 yards fabric for backing (#60008-8 pumpkin print suggested)

25" x 60 " quilt batting

**NOTE:** If making other piece(s) in the *Trick or Treat* ensemble, check cutting instructions of each piece and refigure yardage.

## **Cutting Directions:** All measurements based on a 1/4" seam allowance.

From the **scattered motifs** fabric:

Cut one 10-1/2" x 44" strip recut into two 10-1/2" squares

From the **patchwork print** fabric:

Cut one 10-1/2" x 44" strip recut into two 10-1/2" squares

From the **green bats** fabric:

Cut two 2" x 44" strips then recut into five 2" x 10-1/2" sashing strips

From the **black bats** fabric:

Cut three 2" x 44" strips for border

From the **orange spiders** fabric:

Cut two 3-1/2" x 44" strips for border

From the **purple spiders** fabric:

Cut two 3-1/2" x 44" strips for border

From the **orange bats on black** fabric:

Cut four 2-1/2" x 44" strips for binding

Cut four 1-1/2" x 44" strips for border

An added 1/8 to 1/2 yard is added to all to account for shrinkage, straightening, cutting errors and prints that may require special cutting to get the best results.

You should protect your investment in time and fabric by making sample blocks before cutting into your fabric because Exclusively Quilters will take no responsibility for replacing fabrics.

Shops who wish to kit this design are responsible for figuring yardage for their kits if they wish to reduce yardages.

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## **Pieced Center:**

1. Referring to the quilt diagram, lay out the 10-1/2" patchwork and scattered motifs squares with 2" x 10-1/2" green bat sashing strips between the squares and at each end.
2. Sew the sashing strips to blocks completing the center.

## **Borders:**

1. Cut one 2" x 44" black bat strip into two equal lengths. Sew each half-length strip end-to-end with a full-length strip. Add these borders to the long sides of runner. Press and trim excess from these and all successive border additions.
2. Cut one 3-1/2" x 44" orange spider and one 3-1/2" x 44" purple spider strip each into two equal lengths. Referring to the runner diagram, sew an orange spider half-strip to top and a purple spider half-strip to bottom.
3. Stitch each orange spider and purple spider half-strip remaining to a full-length strip of the same color/print/width. Referring to the quilt diagram, add the orange border to the left and purple border to the right side.
4. Cut two 1-1/2" x 44" orange bats on black strips each into two equal lengths. Sew a half-length strip to the short ends of runner. Stitch the remaining half-length strips end-to-end with full-length strips. Add these to the long edges of runner.

## **Finishing**

1. Layer the backing, batting and runner top. Quilt or tie as desired.
2. Prepare binding from four 2-1/2" x 44" strips of orange bats on black. Sew strips together into one long binding strip. Press strip in half lengthwise.
3. Carefully trim backing and batting even with quilt top.
4. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to 1/4" and press open. Finish sewing tape to quilt.
5. Turn binding to back of quilt and blind stitch in place.
