

# a Trick or Treat Wall Quilt

Quilt by Deb Mosa

Finished Quilt Approximately: 40" x 40" - Finished Center Size: 20" x 20"

**Trick or Treat** fabrics by Exclusively Quilters - Style #3780

## Fabric Requirements: Based on 44" wide fabric

- 1/2 yard pumpkin print (#60008-8)
- 5/8 yard orange spiders (#60009-7)
- 5/8 yard patchwork print (#60006-8)
- 3/8 yard black bats (#60010-3)
- 5/8 yards purple spiders (#60009-3)
- 3/8 yards green bats (#60010-6)
- 1-1/4 yard scattered motifs (#60007-8)
- 2/3 yard orange bats (#60010-7)
- 1-1/2 yards fabric for backing (#60008-3 pumpkins on purple suggested)
- 44" x 44" quilt batting

**NOTE:** If making other piece(s) in the *Trick or Treat* ensemble, check cutting instructions of each piece and refigure yardage.

## Cutting Directions: All measurements based on a 1/4" seam allowance.

From the **pumpkin print** fabric:

Cut one 10-1/2" x 44" strip recut into one 10-1/2" square

From the **orange spiders** fabric:

Cut one 11-1/4" x 44" strip then recut into one 11-1/4" square\*\*

From the **patchwork print** fabric:

Cut one 10-7/8" x 44" strip then recut into two 10-7/8" squares\*\*\*

From the **black bats** fabric:

Cut three 2" x 44" strips for border

From the **purple spiders** fabric:

Cut four 3" x 44" strips for border

From the **green bats** fabric:

Cut four 1-1/2" x 44" strips for border

From the **scattered motifs** fabric:

Cut two 4-1/2" x 36" strips the length of the fabric, parallel to the selvage

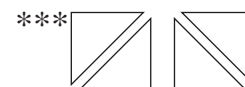
Cut four 4-1/2" by the remaining width of fabric, approximately 30"

From the **orange bats** fabric:

Cut four 2-1/2" x 44" strips for binding

Cut four 1-1/2" x 44" strips for border

Cut squares as indicated:



An added 1/8 to 1/2 yard is added to all yardages to account for shrinkage, straightening, cutting errors and prints that may require special cutting to get the best results.

You should protect your investment in time and fabric by making sample blocks before cutting into your fabric because Exclusively Quilters will take no responsibility for replacing fabrics.

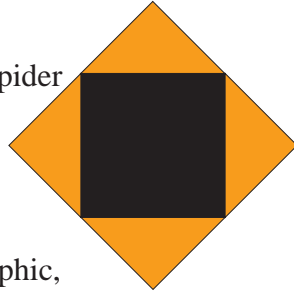
Shops who wish to kit this design are responsible for figuring yardage for their kits if they wish to reduce yardages.

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## Pieced Center:

1. Stitch a 11-1/4" orange spider quarter-square triangle to each side of the 10-1/2" pumpkin square.



2. Referring to the quilt graphic, sew the 10-7/8" patchwork half-square triangles to the corners of the center block.



## Borders:

1. Cut one 2" x 44" black bat strip into two equal halves. Sew half-strips to right and left sides of center. Press and trim excess from these and all successive border additions. Add 2" x 44" black bat strips to the top and bottom of quilt.

2. Stitch 3" x 44" purple spider strips to the right and left sides, then to the top and bottom of quilt.

3. Add a 1-1/2" green bat border in the same manner.

4. Sew the 4-1/2" x 36" scattered motif strips (cut lengthwise) to the right and left sides of quilt. Make two borders, each with two 4-1/2" x 30" scattered motif strips sewn together end-to-end - matching the design as much as possible. Add these to the top and bottom of quilt.

5. Add 1-1/2" orange bat strips to the right and left sides, then to the top and bottom

## Finishing

1. Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt or tie as desired.

2. Prepare binding from four 2-1/2" x 44" strips of orange bats. Sew strips together into one long binding strip. Press strip in half lengthwise.

3. Carefully trim backing and batting even with quilt top.

4. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to 1/4" and press open. Finish sewing tape to quilt.

5. Turn binding to back of quilt and blind stitch in place.
